Sacraments

Through the sacraments, Jesus gives us ways to share in His life. In each of the sacraments, we receive God's life and God's help. The sacraments

have a transforming effect on our lives as we encounter Jesus in a unique and intimate way. He desires this great intimacy out of pure love. Through the gift of grace freely given

At Baptism, we become members of the Church and God's family. The



sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist complete the sacraments of initiation. In the Diocese of Portland, these sacraments have been restored to the original order practiced by the early Church-

Confirmation before Eucharist.

Confirmation deepens and strengthens the grace of Baptism, forming us into disciples of Christ through the Holy Spirit. Confirmation leads us to the Eucharist, which is the heart of the entire Christian life. By receiving Christ's Body and Blood, we enter into loving communion with Him. He invites us to return to him in the Eucharist as often as possible throughout our lives.

Two Year Preparation

Beginning with the 2015-2016 catechetical year, sacrament preparation in the Diocese of Portland is a two year process that includes family involvement. Year One provides an initial formation in the foundations of the faith. Year Two prepares children to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, which includes receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation.



This process will provide children the time to learn and develop a relationship with God; understand and desire the sacraments; learn their prayers; and be involved in the life of the Church. Throughout both years, faith formation opportunities for parents/guardians will strengthen their own faith and support the formation of their children.
