Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u> – Please contact the Rectory Office to schedule a baptism. Parents are required to participate in a baptismal catechetical session prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

<u>Marriage</u> – Arrangements with the parish must be made at least six months prior to the wedding. Fulfillment of a Diocesan, pre-marriage program is required.

Anointing of the Sick - The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one of the healing sacraments of the Church and is not meant only for those who are at the point of death. An illness, a serious injury, impending surgery or advanced age is sufficient reason for the celebration of the Sacrament. Requests for the Anointing of the Sick should be made by calling the rectory at 207-864-3795.

From the Pastor

In today's first reading, the prophet Malachi speaks a word from God that draws a stark contrast between the way those who fear the Lord will be treated and the way those who offend the Lord will be treated. Those of us who are mindful of our sins are well versed in what it means to offend the Lord, but what does it mean to have "fear the Lord."

Fear of the Lord is one of the (7) Gifts of the Holy Spirit. This gift enables a person to avoid sin and attachment to created things out of reverence and love of God. Primarily, this gift entails a profound respect for the majesty of God who is the supreme being. It is not to be understood as the servile fear of God where we tremble if we do something wrong out of fear that God will send us to hell. Rather, true fear of the Lord, as a gift from the Holy Spirit, is based on love, not fear of punishment.

Our relationship with God is one based on love, and fear of the Lord is an apprehension toward doing anything wrong because — out of love — we fear offending God and losing or damaging our relationship with Him. To have the fear of the Lord, as Proverbs 9:10 states, "is the first stage of wisdom." Let us pray to exercise this special gift of the Holy Spirit.
