Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u> – Please contact the Rectory Office to schedule a baptism. Parents are required to participate in a baptismal catechetical session prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

<u>Marriage</u> – Arrangements with the parish must be made at least six months prior to the wedding. Fulfillment of a Diocesan, pre-marriage program is required.

Anointing of the Sick - The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one of the healing sacraments of the Church and is not meant only for those who are at the point of death. An illness, a serious injury, impending surgery or advanced age is sufficient reason for the celebration of the Sacrament. Requests for the Anointing of the Sick should be made by calling the rectory at 207-864-3795.

Also, include your name, a telephone number and the date you would like the Mass to be celebrated. The usual offering is \$10.00. My Dear Parishioners,

Today we close the final week of the Christmas season as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. We remember when the three Magi searched and found Jesus, the King of the Jews. This was the first time Jesus was made manifest to the world, and the first time the world recognized Him as King. The Magi welcomed Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh: gold signifying His kingship; frankincense signifying His divinity; and myrrh signifying His future death.

As we begin this new year, let us to search and find Jesus in our hearts, and rather than giving Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, let us offer Him the gift of a committed life totally devoted to Him. In order to usher in this commitment, today we bless chalk and water, two sacramentals used in the blessing of our homes. As you inscribe the blessing over the main doorway of your home, and as you sprinkle your house with the holy water, commit yourself and your family to a year of deeper prayer and devotion to Jesus, with a special focus on regularly attending Sunday Mass and growing in your love for Him in the Holy Eucharist.
