

MEET THE CONDUCTOR

DR. ALFRED CALABRESE enjoys a diverse career as conductor, educator, composer, scholar, and church musician. He is Director of Music at Saint Rita Catholic Church in Dallas, TX, where he oversees a landmark music program of five choirs including professional singers and the St. Rita Choral Academy for children. In 2023, he conducted the EWTN special “Sounds Of Sacred Music: ‘Misere: A Lenten Prayer Service’” with Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone at Mission Dolores Basilica in San Francisco. Dr. Calabrese holds the Master of Music and Doctor of Music degrees in Conducting from the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. He served as director of choral activities at Southern Methodist University, Emory University, and Brevard College. He has been a visiting professor at several universities including the Conservatoire de Versailles. He has been a guest conductor and clinician in America and abroad and is an active composer for the sacred liturgy.
