

The parish annual faith formation report is consistent way of seeing how evangelization and catechesis take place locally and across the diocese.

The January snapshot of activity benefits the parish by having all faith formation information in one place for planning, ministry-sharing and local accountability. It also assists the diocesan Office of Lifelong Faith Formation (OLFF) in responding to common questions asked by parish leaders and informs discernment of where to focus diocesan resources for supporting parish ministries aimed at forming missionary disciples of Christ in the changing situations the Church faces.

REPORT DIRECTIONS

OLFF maintains separate workbooks for each parish in the diocese and pre-populates cells with known information before sharing report access each January. The parish annual faith formation report gathers data using an Excel workbook consisting of an introduction and six separate spreadsheets for ministry areas:

1.Parish Info, 2. Sacrament Formation, 3. Faith Instruction, 4.Ongoing Formation, 5. Resources, and 6.Catechetical Leaders.

This workbook is hosted on SharePoint which means:

- + only employees with a diocesan email address can be given permission to access or edit the spreadsheet, this includes the current pastor/administrator and employed catechetical leaders in the OLFF contact lists
- + both the parish and the Office of Lifelong Faith Formation can see the changes as soon as the document is saved.
- + the modification date is also recorded automatically.
- + some cells with instructions or headings are "locked" by OLFF so you will be unable to change the format or enter text.
- + after the first year report, the parish should only need to make changes to the prior year's report.

b) Click on a tab at the bottom of the workbook to open one of the spreadsheets.



Follow the directions at the top of each sheet to enter or update information in that formation area for the current fiscal year.

Please click into the "Parish Info" tab before exiting the workbook as the file opens to whichever spreadsheet was in use the last time the workbook was saved.

The sheets are layed out for 8x14 landscape printing if you choose to print spreadsheets for offline use.
