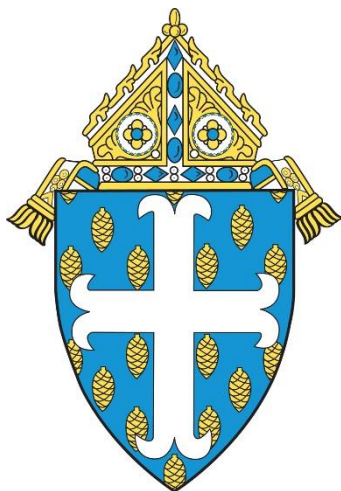
Invitation to Pray for Vocations to the Priesthood
