4th stage: I was a stranger and you welcomed me

1st reader:

«Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me» (Mt 25:40).

2nd reader:

"The encounter with the migrant, as with every brother and sister in need, "is also an encounter with Christ. He himself said so. It is he who knocks on our door, hungry, thirsty, an outsider, naked, sick and imprisoned, asking to be met and assisted" [...] Every encounter along the way represents an opportunity to meet the Lord; it is an occasion charged with salvation, because Jesus is present in the sister or brother in need of our help. In this sense, the poor save us, because they enable us to encounter the face of the Lord²."

Introduction

Since the beginning of his magisterium, Pope Francis has always encouraged all people of good will to "create spaces of encounter" with fellow migrants and refugees, because it is only through encounter that prejudices are broken down, only by looking into the eyes of others, by listening to their story, that we encounter Jesus through them.

For this World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR), Pope Francis has chosen "God Walks with His People" as the title for his message, to remind us that all of us, God's people, are migrants on this earth, on the way to the "true homeland," and that the God who walks with us we can also be found in our brothers and sisters, especially in the most vulnerable.

Therefore, in view of the celebrations for WDMR2024, we would like to suggest to all men and women "of good will" to organize a **step-by-step itinerary** on the theme "God walks with His People." The initiative can be organized in the form of a **meditative walk**, in which we concretely walk together and stop at pre-established points to meditate on certain passages of the Sacred Scriptures and the message, or in a **symbolic form**, such as a vigil, or a moment of reflection that has these stages as a common thread. The stages of the itinerary should not be organized FOR our migrant brothers and sisters, but WITH them, involving them whenever possible in the animation of these moments.

Below we offer some ideas, taken from the message, from which to organize the stages of this journey together, but then we leave it to the availability and creativity of each local reality to better define these moments.



3rd stage: God walks Within us

1st reader:

«I have moved from tent to tent and from dwelling to dwelling» (1 Cr 17:5).

2nd reader:

"The tent is a form of presence especially dear to the Lord. During David's reign, God chose to dwell in a tent, not a temple, so that he could walk with his people. [...] God not only walks with his people, but also within them, in the sense that he identifies himself with men and women on their journey through history, particularly with the least, the poor and the marginalized. In this we see an extension of the mystery of the Incarnation."

1st stage: Towards the true homeland

1st reader:

«Our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ» (Phil 3:20).

2nd reader:

"The People of God [is] journeying through history on pilgrimage, "migrating", we could say, toward the Kingdom of Heaven¹. The biblical narrative of Exodus, depicting the Israelites on their way to the promised land, naturally comes to mind: a long journey from slavery to freedom [...].

Likewise, it is possible to see in the migrants of our time, as in those of every age, a living image of God's people on their way to the eternal homeland."

2nd stage: God walks with us

1st reader:

«The Lord your God goes with you; he will not fail you or forsake you» (Deut 31:6).

2nd reader:

"The fundamental reality of the Exodus, of every exodus, is that God precedes and accompanies his people and all his children in every time and place. [...]

Many migrants experience God as their traveling companion, guide and anchor of salvation. They entrust themselves to him before setting out and seek him in times of need. In him, they find consolation in moments of discouragement. Thanks to him, there are good Samaritans along the way. In prayer, they confide their hopes to him."
