- ❖ **Good Friday** – April 19, 2019, is a day of fast and abstinence (from meat) in the universal Church.
- ❖ **Every Friday of Lent** – All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (from meat) in the Church in the United States.
- ❖ **The Law of Abstinence (from Meat)** – Binds Catholics aged 14 and older.
- ❖ **The Law of Fasting** – Binds Catholics aged 18 and over, until the beginning of their 60th year (through age 59).

*The three pillars of the Lenten season are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.*

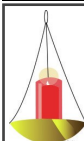

### *The Pastor's Corner*

In the classic play *Julius Caesar*, William Shakespeare tells the tragic story of Julius Caesar who was betrayed by his best friend, Marcus Junius Brutus. Caesar was warned by his wife not to go out on the Ides of March, but Brutus, knowing the evil they had planned against him, encouraged him to go out. Brutus had already conspired with some senators to attack his friend Caesar who they had considered a tyrant. When Caesar saw that Brutus was involved in the attack, he knew he had been betrayed by a friend. Although Caesar had been stabbed several times by others, the stab by Brutus was so deep that he immediately died, uttering the words, "Et tu Brute" (and you Brutus?).

Today's narrative of the Passion and Death of Jesus presents similarities between the murder of Caesar and that of Christ. Both were murdered by a group of conspirators and their deaths were facilitated by the betrayal of some of their closest friends who spent time with them. Judas played a significant role in salvation history, because his treachery facilitated Christ's passion and death-the acts that won salvation for us. Unlike Brutus, Judas never wanted Jesus to die. Rather, he was interested in the money he would get if he assisted the chief priests in arresting Jesus. Having seen Jesus escape from the Pharisees many times before, he probably thought that Jesus would miraculously save himself. Their real purpose only became clear to him when he saw that Jesus was condemned to death. Today, for the same love of money, people are terrorized and killed, substandard and dangerous products are sold in stores, the dignity of the human person is destroyed and our friendship with God compromised. Each time we engage in things like this, we betray Jesus.

As we celebrate the events of the greatest act of God's love for us, the Church also challenges us to make our lives a witness to the passion of Christ. We are called to rise above greed, selfishness, and hypocrisy and give ourselves over to Gospel living. That is why the first reading presents us with the image of the suffering servant who learned to obey God through suffering and pain. In the end, he was glorified because he maintained his friendship with God by being attentive and obedient to the voice of God.

Today, as friends of God, how faithful are we to his call for us? How faithful have we been to preservation and passing on of the Catholic view of family life and morality? Do we try to live out all the moral teachings of our Church in our homes and our community? Have we worked to preserve the dignity and integrity of every human person? For instance, imagine that a Catholic is also a local business owner.

Does that Catholic sell items like pornography or contraception? Both things, by the way, can be violations of the fifth and sixth commandments. By profiting from the sale of such items, not only is that business owner compromising his or her own witness as a disciple of Christ, he or she is also betraying Christ, and all for a few bucks.

We are quick to blame Judas and anyone else who openly betrays Christ and his Church. In fact, we are too quick to judge people like Peter who denied him three times or the disciples and others who have run from the Church. But are we really any better than they are? Betrayal is an unexpected blow from one we love. Each time we use our positions in the community or our family to show approval of, legalize, or support evil or immoral behaviors, we betray God, who loves us more than anyone else. Every time we keep silent in the face of evil, we are denying Christ openly. When we avoid our duties toward God and our fellow man, we are no different than the disciples who ran away from Jesus, who died for their sakes and ours.

Friends, like it or not, if we are honest with ourselves, we see that there are times when we have all betrayed God and our neighbors. If you've done this, don't lose hope! Be repentant like Peter and ask for mercy. Go to Confession. If you've been betrayed by someone that should have cared about you, look to Jesus for healing. Don't take revenge, continue to love other people, and remain obedient to God-just as Jesus did. Remember that every act of obedience has a heavenly reward -the biggest of which is a solid friendship with Jesus himself!
