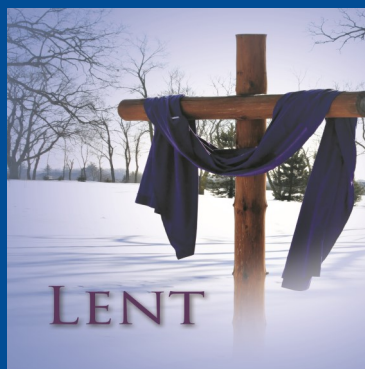

Fast & Abstinence

- ❖ **Ash Wednesday & Good Friday** – Both March 6, 2019, and April 19, 2019, are days of fast and abstinence (from meat) in the universal Church.
- ❖ **Every Friday of Lent** – All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (from meat) in the Church in the United States.
- ❖ **The Law of Abstinence** (from Meat) – Binds Catholics aged 14 and older.
- ❖ **The Law of Fasting** – Binds Catholics aged 18 and over, until the beginning of their 60th year (through age 59).

The Pastor's Corner

Lent is just around the corner. Pretty soon, we will be in the Holy Season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. To help you on your Lenten Journey, I offer the following suggestions:



Prayer:

-Read the Sunday Mass readings *before Sunday*. Most of us who follow sports know that familiarizing ourselves with the players, opposing teams, and coaching strategies makes for a fuller experience of the game. Familiarizing ourselves with the readings for Mass will help us enter more deeply into the Eucharistic Celebration. The readings and other prayers can be accessed for free on the website www.ibreviary.com.

-Pray the Stations of the Cross.

-Visit the Church for Eucharistic Adoration.

-Make an extra effort to attend Daily Masses during the week.

-Pray the Rosary. If you already pray it daily, consider adding an extra decade to your practice. If you don't pray it regularly, try praying a decade a day. If you don't know how to pray the Rosary, make it your Lenten discipline to learn how to pray it. Packages of rosaries along with instructions on how to pray the Rosary can be found at the back of the Church.

-Read the Bible. Start with Mark's Gospel. It's the shortest and easiest to digest.

-Find one new prayer that you would like to learn and pray it every day.

Fasting:

-Give up a favorite food or drink.

-Fast from TV or entertainment on electronic devices.

-If you're a news junkie, consider giving up the twenty-four-hour news channels.

-If you eat out or do take out frequently, consider cooking all or most of your meals at home.

Almsgiving:

-Consider giving charitably to organizations like **Catholic Relief Services** or the **Knights of Columbus**. Both organizations do outstanding work in supporting the needy and breaking the cycle of poverty. If you and your family are experiencing financial difficulty and are unable to tithe because of it, consider enrolling in a program like **Dave Ramsey** (www.daveramsey.com). Such programs have helped thousands of people become better stewards of the financial gifts that God has given them.

I also recommend signing up for **Best Lent Ever** by *Dynamic Catholic* (<https://dynamiccatholic.com/best-lent-ever>).

Upon signing up, you'll receive daily emails with short inspirational videos, practical tips for your life, and personal stories from the Dynamic Catholic team. You'll learn simple yet powerful ways to transform your life in forty days—and you'll be well on your way to becoming the person God created you to be.
