Mass Intentions are a wonderful way to remember a loved one.

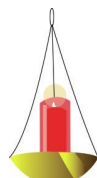

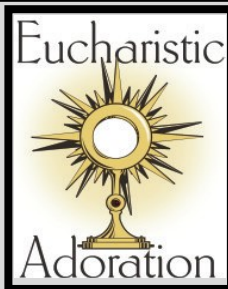

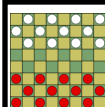

The Pastor's Corner

October is a special month in the life of the Church. It's special for two reasons. First, for the Catholic Church in America, October is known as *Respect Life Month*. During this month, the Church in the United States take the time to reflect on God's gift of human life, and how we can work to ensure that the dignity of each and every human life is upheld.

To the aid us in our reflection, the Pro-Life Activity Office of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has prepared several articles on various pro-life issues. Beginning today, and for the entire month of October, each issue of our parish bulletin will feature one of these articles. The articles are intended to help us better understand these issues and how we can properly support loved ones facing tough life decisions. The second reason October is special to Catholics is this: October is known in the Universal Church as the **Month of the Most Holy Rosary**. This is due to the fact the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7th. This feast was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection she gives the Church in answer to the Rosary as it is prayed by the faithful.

According to Catholic tradition, St. Dominic received the Holy Rosary directly from the Blessed Virgin in 1206. Dominic had been praying and doing penance because of his own failure to defeat certain heresies. According to tradition, Mary appeared to him and encouraged him. She also gave him a weapon, the Rosary-a new way of praying. Because this way of praying was so new, the Blessed Mother taught him how to say the Rosary, asked him to preach about this devotion and to teach others to pray it as well. Since then, many victories-personal and public-have been credited to praying and meditating on the Rosary.

To help us grow in our understanding of the power of the Rosary and its role in the liturgical life of the Church, I will be offering three pre-Mass catechetical sessions on the Most Holy Rosary. These sessions will be based on St. John Paul II's apostolic letter *Rosarium Virginis Mariae-On the Most Holy Rosary*.

These sessions will begin on the weekend of October 12 and 13 and continue until the last Sunday in October. Each session will begin approximately ten minutes before the scheduled Mass and will be five minutes in length. Printed copies of each teaching will be made available at the end of each Mass. As I will not be covering the Rosary in *Oremus*, these sessions will also be a helpful complement to the prayer styles that will be studied by those who also attend those sessions.

With this in mind, I invite all of you to participate in Holy Family's annual *America Needs Fatima* campaign on Saturday, October 12, 2019 at noon. More information on this can be found in this week's bulletin.
